

INTRODUCTION

The history of the Faculty of Graduate Studies runs back to year 2000. When it was first established on 13th January as the MSc Section to offer the MSc (Defence Studies) Degree in Management for Senior Officers of the Sri Lanka Army, Sri Lanka Navy, Sri Lanka Air Force, and Sri Lanka Police. Subsequently, the BSc (Defence Studies) Degree in Management was introduced in the year 2003 by the MSc Section for deserving Middle Level officers of the Tri-services and Police. The MSc section was renamed on 29th October 2003 as the Staff Development and Career Advancement Division, on 05th May 2009 as Institute of Post Graduate Studies (IPGS) and finally as the Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) on 01st March 2012. In year 2012, FGS has opened doors to enlist Executive Officers of Public and Private Sector for Post Graduate Programmes.

Faculty of Graduate Studies, was initially established at the Defence and Strategic Studies premises of KDU, and later established in a sixstoried building with the modern facilities, on 4 August 2015. At present. Infrastructure facilities avail at FGS includes, Modern state-of-the-art Auditorium with 293 seating capacity,16 no of lecture theaters with different seating capacities (10 lecture theatres with the capacity for 30 students, 06 lecture theatres with the capacity for 50 students), an Examination Hall with 250 seating capacity and a well-equipped Computer Laboratory and as well as ultra-modern Conference Hall for Board meetings.

At present, FGS is engaged in conducting 10 Post Graduate Degree Programmes for Officers of the Tri-Services and the Police as well as for the Public and Private Sector Executives who are eager to expand their professional profiles with additional qualifications. Most importantly, FGS offers Master of Philosophy and Doctor of Philosophy Degrees thereby reaching the zenith of academic activities of a university. FGS currently conducts its Post Graduate

Programmes in the disciplines of Management, Logistics Management, E-Governance, programs of Laws with specialization, Security and Strategic Studies, Engineering and Disaster Risk Reduction and Development. Academic requirements of these programmes of FGS are being directed through,

There are three Boards of Study at FGS as follows;

- Board of Studies on Management and Social Studies
- Board of Studies on Engineering, Computing and Spatial Sciences and Technology
- Board of Studies on Medical and Biological Sciences

In planning and conducting these programmes, the Faculty coordinates with the best resource personnel in the country representing academic and professional fields. 



INTRODUCTION

The Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) of Kotelawala Defence University (KDU) provides

programs leading to the award of MPhil and

WINDOW I

Due to the nature of responsibilities and commitments connected with their working environments, some of the service and civil candidates may need an additional exposure to improve their knowledge in Research Methodology. An opportunity exists for such candidates to develop their research skills by following course modules on Proposal Writing Techniques and Research Methodology. The Research Methodology module comprises an Introduction to Research Methodology, Scientific Communication and Statistical Techniques for Research, which are designed to upgrade the knowledge and skills of the candidates in addition to the guidance provided by their supervisors. The course also consists of a course module on National Interests conducted by eminent resource persons to upgrade their knowledge on national development. These three compulsory course modules are considered as a prior necessity for the candidates who register through Window 1, and they shall follow them while engaging in their Research Projects.

The candidates selected under Window 1 are initially given a provisional registration during which they are expected to learn the foundations to develop a research proposal, with the guidance of the supervisor. They shall present their proposal before a Proposal Evaluation Committee, and upon the acceptance of the proposals, they will be registered for the degree programme.

WINDOW 2

Some candidates may already have prior experience in research and have already identified the supervisors and the area of research. For example, those candidates who have secured research grants by themselves or by their supervisors fall under this category. These candidates have already gone through the phase of proposal development, and hence are not required to follow the prerequisite courses mentioned in above window 1. However, the supervisors may recommend them to follow certain modules of window 1 and any other courses arranged by the Faculty of Graduate Studies, based on their individual requirements during their research work.

OBJECTIVES

To realize the overall goal described above, the FGS has set the following educational objectives for MPhil and PhD degrees.

MPhil and Doctoral Degrees

An MPhil degree will be conferred to those who have completed a minimum two-year period of residence, studied the compulsory subjects,



passed the required examinations specified in By-Laws and passed the thesis review and Viva Voce under the guidance of an academic supervisor.

A doctoral degree will be conferred to those who have completed a minimum of three-year period of residence, studied the compulsory subjects passed the required examinations specified in By-Laws, and passed the thesis review and final examinations under the requisite guidance of an academic supervisor.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY

The minimum requirements for registration for MPhil degree programme are:

- A Master's Degree (SLQF L9/10) in a relevant field from a recognized university; or
- A Bachelor's degree in a relevant field of fouryear duration (SLQF L6) with a First or Second Class from a recognized university; or
- A Bachelor's degree in a relevant field of three-year duration (SLQF L5) with a First or Second Class and with a minimum of twoyear experience in the relevant field; or
- Passed Staff College (psc)/ Logistics Staff Course (lsc) or an equivalent from a local or foreign institution with a minimum of 20 years of service and evidence of at least one research publication. This includes journal articles/conference papers; or
- Any other relevant qualifications recommended by the relevant Board of Study, accepted by the Faculty Board, Faculty of Graduate Studies and approved by the Senate.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY

The minimum requirements for registration are:

- An MPhil degree in a relevant field from a recognized university; or
- An approval by the Senate for upgrading from an MPhil to PhD programme; or
- A Bachelor's degree in a relevant field of fulltime four-year duration (SLQF L6) with a First Class from a recognized university, and with evidence for adequate experience in research as acceptable to the relevant Board of Study; or
- Any other qualification equivalent to a fulltime two-year research degree (SLQF L 11) acceptable to the relevant Board of Study and to the Faculty Board, Faculty of Graduate Studies and approved by the Senate.

COURSE SYLLABUS

The orientation programme offers 5 modules, namely, Proposal Writing Techniques, Introduction to Research Methodology, Scientific Communication, Statistical Techniques for Research, and National Interests. The orientation programme is compulsory for Window 1 candidates and optional for window 2 candidates.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Total course modules are worth of 14 credits. The program commences by offering the Proposal Writing Techniques in the first month in every other weekends on both Saturday and Sunday. The students are expected to submit the Research Proposal, and give a proposal presentation within the provisional registration period while attending lectures of other four modules.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN **MANAGEMENT**

INTRODUCTION

The Faculty of Graduate Studies provides a rare opportunity to obtain a Master's Degree in Management (MSc in Management). The programme covers a broad spectrum of management related subjects including all the key areas needed to become a successful team leader. The programme is ideal for those seeking careers in general management or whose current role requires enhanced managerial and leadership capabilities.

The degree programme was designed following the Sri Lankan Qualification Framework and its academic standard is equivalent to Sri Lanka Qualifications Framework Level 10. The degree was designed by a panel of senior academics and professionals from reputed universities/ institutions in Sri Lanka ensuring a high academic standard to facilitate participants to complete the degree in two years even whilst being employed. Lectures are held every other weekend at FGS-KDU and the rest of the learning is through independent learning carried out at the participant's convenience. The medium of instruction is English and all the lectures are webcast through the mlearning platform of KDU. Further, KDU-LMS is utilized for student-lecturer interactions and continuous assessments. The Msc in management degree provides broad skills, knowledge, and tools necessary to advance graduates career in the global competitive economy. The graduates can work in a variety of management roles across private, public, and not-for-profit sectors.

OBJECTIVES

The MSc in Management programme has a clear professional approach and is well suited to the officers of the Tri-services and the Police and Executive Officers of Public / Private Sector who wish to make progress in various fields where an analytical focus is important. Further the programme;

- a. Develops an in-depth knowledge of the art in management.
- b. Builds and enhances career plans through specialized subject modules.
- c. Strengthens the ability to live and work in a highly multicultural environment.
- d. Prepares to take up major challenges in economic environment with a global perspective.

INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES

On successful completion of this Master's Degree, students will have enhanced their skills in,

- a. Problem solving in Management through the application of updated management knowledge, principles and exposure.
- b. Communication of Management and commerce related ideas, concepts and solutions to peers and the wider community.
- c. Practicing modern Management systems based on team work and, respecting others' views and ethical behaviors.
- d. Research skills including the retrieval of information from a variety of sources and critical analytical ability.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Eligibility criteria for MSc in Management Degree Programme are as follows:

a. He/ She is a Commissioned Officer of Tri-Services / Gazetted Police Officer / Public and Private Sector Executive Officer having a





Bachelors' Degree with 1st Class from a recognized university with a minimum of one (01) year of service or

- b. He/ She is a Commissioned Officer of Tri-Services / Gazetted Police Officer / Public and Private Sector Executive Officer having a Bachelors' Degree with 2nd Class from a recognized university with a minimum of two (02) years of service or
- c. He/ She is a Commissioned Officer in the rank of Captain / Lieutenant / Flight Lieutenant and above or Gazetted Police Officer or Public and Private sector Executive Officer with a Bachelors' Degree from a recognized university with a minimum of three (03) years of Service or
- d. He/She is a Commissioned Officer in the rank of Major/Lieutenant Commander/Squadron Leader and above or Gazetted Police Officer or Public and Private sector Executive Officer with a minimum of seven (07) years of Service and
- e. Candidates are required to possess satisfactory skills in English language.

COURSE SYLLABUS

The programme contains 16 compulsory subject modules. If a candidate intends to complete the MSc in Management programme, he/she is required to complete all 16 compulsory subject modules, the dissertation within a maximum period of five (05) years.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Candidates are required to earn 63 credits including the credits allocated to the dissertation in two years to obtain the MSc Degree in Management or complete the academic requirements including the mini dissertation of the first year to obtain the Postgraduate Diploma in Management. Any violation of rules and regulations stipulated by KDU on conduct and discipline will lead to cancellation of your studentship.

The duration of the MSc in Management is four semesters (two academic years) and classes are conducted on every other weekend of other than in public holidays from 0830 hrs to 1730 hrs.



The programme is designed by the Department of Strategic Studies at General Sir John Kotelawala Defence University. SSIR combines the knowledge from various fields such as international relations, geography, economy, international law, conflict resolution, security studies, and others related fields. The programme is intended to generate a comprehensive knowledge about various strategic issues in today's international relations. In this programme, students are provided with the opportunity to interact with resource persons from diplomatic community, military, and other relevant fields apart from interacting with the academics from KDU and other universities.

SSIR programme is specially meant for the students who are interested in jobs related to fields such as diplomatic service, government ministries, United Nations, NGO's/INGO's and other related fields. The programme is also beneficial for persons in the private sector who do or seek jobs related to Strategic Studies and International Relations.

OBJECTIVES

MSSIR envisions the development of strategic community and broadening their horizons in order to serve the National Interest of Sri Lanka. This master's porogramme is in line with the following objectives,

- a. Enhance students' knowledge in Strategic Studies and International Relations as an interdisciplinary field of Study.
- b. Educate on various theories, concepts, methodologies, and techniques related to

Strategic Studies & International Relations in order to broaden scope of the students.

- c. Develop the skills to identify the contemporary global and regional issues and its relevance to Sri Lanka.
- d. Explain the strategic importance of Sri Lanka in regional and world politics.
- e. Describe the importance of a country foreign policy and the changes of Sri Lanka's foreign policy under different governments.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

A person is eligible for admission to the programme of study leading to the Master Degree in Strategic Studies & International Relations, provided he/she meets one of the following conditions:

- a. He/ She is a Commissioned Officer/ Police Officer/ Public and Private sector Executive Officer having a Bachelors' Degree with 1st Class from recognized university with a minimum of one (01) year of service/work experience or
- b. He/ She is a Commissioned Officer/ Police Officer/ Public and Private sector Executive Officer having a Bachelors' Degree with 2nd Class from recognized university with a minimum of two (02) years of service/work experience or
- c. He/ She is a Commissioned Officer in the rank of Captain/ Lieutenant/ Flight Lieutenant and above or Police Officer in the rank of IP and above or Public and Private sector Executive Officer with a Bachelors' Degree from a recognized university with a minimum of three (03) years of service/work experience or
- d. He/ She is a Commissioned Officer in the rank of Major/ Lieutenant Commander/ Squadron Leader and above or Gazetted Police Officer or Public and Private sector Executive Officer with a minimum of seven (07) years of Service/ work experience.

However, a person who is currently registered for a Degree Programme as an internal/external candidate of any University or Higher Educational Institution is not eligible to be registered for any of the Degree Programme of the KDU and vice versa, unless the candidate registers with two distinct institutions and provides sufficient evidence to prove his/ her competence to pursue such degree programmes simultaneously.

COURSE SYLLABUS

The programme contains 17 compulsory subject modules and a dissertation on guided research. If a candidate intends to complete the MSc in Strategic Studies & International Relations Programme, he / she is required to complete all 17 compulsory subject modules and the research component.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Candidates are required to earn 60 credits including the credits allocated to the dissertation within two academic years to obtain the Masters Degree in Strategic Studies and International Relations or complete the academic requirements including a mini dissertation in the first year to obtain the Postgraduate Diploma in Security & Strategic Studies. INTRODUCTION

Faculty of Graduate Studies in collaboration with the Department of Electrical, Electronics & Telecommunication Engineering offers MSc in Electrical Engineering programme. This postgraduate programme is conducted for a period of two years. The first year is dedicated for taught course modules and second year is for both taught modules and there search project. The programme covers advanced engineering concepts and theories, enabling them to concentrate on a specific field of electrical engineering.

The programme has been designed by a panel of senior academics and professionals from reputed universities/institutions in Sri Lanka, ensuring a high academic standard to facilitate participants to complete MSc in Electrical Engineering in accordance with the Sri Lankan Qualification Framework which is published by the Ministry of Higher Education. Moreover, it should be noted that its academic standard is equivalent to Sri Lanka Qualifying level 10.

Although electrical engineers can work in many fields, an engineer with just a bachelor's degree might only have exposure to the basic fundamentals of engineering. This limited knowledge restricts the scope of positions for which they qualify. To improve prospects, engineering professionals must pursue a master's level electrical engineering program. 

INTRODUCTION

Msc in Biomedical Engineering Degree is an interdisciplinary Programme, which has been designed to train graduates who are interested in applying modern engineering methods to understand, modify and control biological systems with the goal of improving health and quality of life. Today, understanding and overcoming healthrelated challenges requires multidisciplinary professionals who thrive in both biomedical and engineering environments. The curriculum of this programme has been designed to provide students with a good grasp of core contents of Biomedical engineering. Also, to foster logical and analytical thinking, independent study, selfmotivation and communication skills, awareness of research and developments, and latest trends in the key areas of the field. Graduates of this programme enter the workforce with the knowledge and expertise needed to excel in specialties, including prosthetics, artificial organs, biometrics systems, medical devices manufacture, clinical engineering, rehabilitation, sport medicine, tissue engineering etc.

OBJECTIVES

Programme educational objectives describe the career and professional accomplishments and what the programme prepares graduates to achieve in the professional career. These are as follows.

- a. Demonstrate technical competence in designing engineering systems, processes, materials to solve complex engineering problems in the field of Biomedical Engineering.
- b. Function as effectively as a leader/member in a multidisciplinary team with effective communication skills, highest professional


and ethical standards, leadership, and teamwork skills.

- c. Demonstrate a thorough understanding of theoretical knowledge and critical awareness of current issues and recent developments in the area of biomedical engineering and/or area of professional practice.
- d. Demonstrate commitment to lifelong learning, professional development, selfdirection, originality in problem solving and implementation of professional tasks by pursuing research and professional practices.

INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the completion of the degree programme a student will be able to.

- a. Identify and apply knowledge of engineering sciences, medical sciences, mathematics, computer science, and biological sciences in solving complex biomedical engineering problems.
- b. Define the complexity of human biology and anatomy concerning biomedical engineering modelling.
- c. Investigate complex problems using research-based knowledge and research methods including design of experiments, analysis, and interpretation of data.
- d. Analyze complex biomedical engineering problems, and reach valid conclusions using knowledge of mathematics, natural sciences, and engineering sciences.
- e. Design solutions for biomedical engineering problems to meet specific needs with appropriate attitudes, values and considerations for public health, safety, cultural perspectives, ethical, societal, and environmental concerns.



- f. Use and apply appropriate techniques, resources, and modern tools, to complex biomedical engineering problems, with an understanding of the limitations
- g. Apply ethical principles in biomedical engineering and commit to professional ethics and responsibilities and norms of biomedical engineering practice.
- h. Function effectively as an individual, and as a member or leader in teams and multidisciplinary settings
- I Communicate effectively on complex biomedical engineering activities with the engineering and medical community and with society at large.
- j. Demonstrate knowledge and skills in management & economic principles on decision-making, and apply them to own work, as a team member/leader in multidisciplinary environments.
- k. Engage in independent and life-long learning in the broadest context of biomedical engineering technological advancements and continuous professional development.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Applicants satisfying the following requirements are eligible for admission:

- a. Degree of Bachelor of Science in Engineering, MBBS, Allied health sciences, Physics, Biological Sciences Computer science, Chemistry, Biochemistry of four-year duration or
- b. Degree of Bachelor of Science (Defence Studies) in a relevant field with a minimum of three years of appropriate experience as an Engineer as approved by the relevant Board

- of Studies of Faculty of Graduate Studies at KDU.or
- c. A Bachelor of Science Degree (SLQF 5) in a relevant field* from a recognized University; with minimum of three years of appropriate experience in relevant field after obtaining such a degree, as may be approved by therelevant Board of Studies of Faculty of Graduate Studies at KDU. or
- d. Associate Membership or above of Institution of Engineers Sri Lanka (IESL) AND a minimum of three years of appropriate experience after obtaining such membership as approved by the relevant Board of Studies of Faculty of Graduate Studies at KDU. or
- e. Associate Membership or above of a professional Engineering Institute recognized by Institution of Engineers Sri Lanka (IESL) AND a minimum of three years of appropriate experience after obtaining such membership as approved by the relevant Board of Studies of Faculty of Graduate Studies at KDU.or
- f. A Higher Diploma (SLQF 4) in a relevant field with a minimum of five years of appropriate experience in a relevant field after obtaining such a higher diploma, as may be approved by the relevant Board of Studies of Faculty of Graduate Studies at KDU. or
- g. A professional qualification equivalent to SLQF6 or above of relevant field* as approved by the relevant Board of Studies of Faculty of Graduate Studies at KDU. or
- h. Completion of NVQ level 7 of relevant field* and minimum 5 years of experience in the relevant field* as approved by the relevant Board of Studies of Faculty of Graduate Studies at KDU.

COURSE SYLLABUS

The first and second semesters are composed of mandatory modules (30 GPA credits, 7 NGPA credits). This is followed by third semester of either elective modules and an individual project relevant to field of specialization; or an independent study with research project (15 GPA credits and 3 NGPA) and the thesis in the final semester (15 GPA Credits). This structure forms a coherent line of study and provides students with both the depth and breadth of knowledge needed to specialize in their field. In addition, candidates must be able to spend a considerable amount of time for self-studies, homework, assignments, field visits, discussions, guest lecturers etc., throughout the program.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The MSc in Biomedical Engineering is a 2-year programme (60 GPS Credits, 10 NGPA Credits), structured in six fields of specialization, (Biomedical Engineering Bio medical implants and instrumentation, biomedical imaging and radiology, Biomedical Data Sciences, Orthotics & Prosthetic designing, Genome and Engineering Biology, Neural Engineering) where

independent study and research work is expected to interlace. The program is consisted with three exit points as postgraduate diploma (30 GPA credits; SLQF level 8), MSc by Course work (45 GPA credits; SLQF level 9) and MSc with research (60 GPA credits, SLQF level 10). Lectures and practical sessions are conducted on Saturdays (between 8.00 am to 5.30 pm) and Sundays (between 8.00 am to 5.30 pm) in Faculty of Graduate Studies, General Sir John Kotelawala Defence University. The lectures are also supplemented with online interactions via Moodle.

The first and second semesters are composed of mandatory modules (30 GPA credits, 7 NGPA credits). This is followed by third semester of either elective modules and an individual project relevant to field of specialization; or an independent study with research project (15 GPA credits and 3 NGPA) and the thesis in the final semester (15 GPA Credits). 
