

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Introduction

The Faculty of Graduate Studies provides a rare opportunity to obtain a Master's Degree in Management (MSc in Management). The programme covers a broad spectrum of management related subjects including all the key areas needed to become a successful team leader. The programme is ideal for those seeking careers in general management or whose current role requires enhanced managerial and leadership capabilities.

The degree programme was designed following the Sri Lankan Qualification Framework and its academic standard is equivalent to Sri Lanka Qualifications Framework Level 10. The degree was designed by a panel of senior academics and professionals from reputed universities/ institutions in Sri Lanka ensuring a high academic standard to facilitate participants to complete the degree in two years even whilst being employed. Lectures are held every other weekend at FGS-KDU and the rest of the learning is through independent learning carried out at the participant's convenience. The medium of instruction is English and all the lectures are webcast through the m-learning platform of KDU. Further, KDU-LMS is utilized for studentlecturer interactions and continuous assessments. The MSc in management degree provides broad skills, knowledge, and tools necessary to advance graduates career in the global competitive economy. The graduates can work in a variety of management roles across private, public, and not-for-profit sectors.

Objectives

The MSc in Management programme has a clear professional approach and is well suited to the officers of Tri services and the Police and Executive Officers of Public / Private Sector who wish to make progress in various fields where an analytical focus is important. Further the programme

- a. develops an in-depth knowledge of the art in management.
- b. builds and enhances career plans through specialized subject modules.
- c. strengthens the ability to live and work in a highly multicultural environment.
- d. prepares to take up major challenges in economic environment with a global perspective.

Intended Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of this Master's Degree, students will have enhanced their skills in

- a. Problem solving in management through the application of updated management knowledge, principles, and exposure.
- b. Communication of management and commerce related ideas, concepts and solutions to peers and the wider community.
- c. Practicing modern management systems based on teamwork and, respecting others' views and ethical behaviours.
- d. Research skills including the retrieval of information from a variety of sources and critical analytical ability.

Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility criteria for MSc in Management Degree Programme are as follows:

- a. He/She is a Commissioned Officer of Tri-Services/Gazetted Police Officer/ Public and Private Sector Executive Officer having a Bachelors' Degree with 1st Class from a recognized university with a minimum of one (01) year of service or
- b. He/She is a Commissioned Officer of Tri-Services / Gazetted Police Officer / Public and Private Sector Executive Officer having a



- Bachelors' Degree with 2ndClass from a recognized university with a minimum of two (02) years of service or
- c. He/ She is a Commissioned Officer in the rank of Captain / Lieutenant / Flight Lieutenant and above or Gazetted Police Officer or Public and Private sector Executive Officer with a Bachelors' Degree from a recognized university with a minimum of three (03) years of Service or
- d. He/She is a Commissioned Officer in the rank of Major/Lieutenant Commander/Squadron Leader and above or Gazetted Police Officer or Public and Private sector Executive Officer with a minimum of seven (07) years of Service and
- e. Candidates are required to possess satisfactory skills in English language.

Programme Structure

Candidates are required to earn 63 credits including the credits allocated to the dissertation in two years to obtain the MSc Degree in Management or complete the academic requirements including a project report of the first year to obtain the Postgraduate Diploma in Management. Any violation of rules and regulations stipulated by KDU on conduct and discipline will lead to cancellation of your studentship.

The duration of the MSc in Management is four semesters (two academic years) and classes are conducted on every other weekend other than on public holidays from 0830 hrs to 1730 hrs.

Continuous Assessments

Instructions for Submission of Continuous Assessments

a. FGS expects the highest professional, academic and scholarly standards in student

- assignments. Therefore, haphazard, incomplete or hurried assignments will not qualify for marking.
- b. Marks obtained for assignments will be added to the examination marks; FGS expects the students to work hard, consider these assignments seriously and concentrate on them. Assignments are potentially powerful learning resources for communication.
- c. Assignments call for a significant degree of knowledge, analysis and critique. Therefore, the students must prepare in advance for their assignments thoroughly and well. Assignments should not be completed in a rush.
- d. Students must try out different drafts and work hard on them.
- e. There are no extensions on assignment submission dates. Students are responsible for submitting their assignments on due date.

Specifications for Assignments

- a. Students must always use only A4 size paper to compliance their assignments.
- b. Leave a 1" Margin on all four sides.
- c. Students must type or word process their assignment answers. If a student is unable to do so, he / she must write the answer very neatly and legibly. Assignments with illegible handwriting will not be marked.

- e. Students must be creative in approaching and answering questions.
- f. If a student uses another author's idea, he / she must cite that author / publication with references.


